2008 Legislative Scorecard  
Bill Summaries

- 1 SB1164** Healthcare Group; report; temporary freeze.  
Requires the Arizona Health Care Cost Containment System (AHCCCS) to set premiums for Healthcare Group (HCG) based on actuarial reviews by an independent actuary. It freezes enrollment in HCG for three years, and requires the Department of Insurance (DOI) to report on the operational effects of the freeze on HCG. It also prohibits HCG health plans from providing services outside the scope of their contracts, and requires the AHCCCS to establish utilization management control standards for HCG health plans.
- 2 SB1223** Insurance; long-term care.  
Modifies the preexisting condition limitation periods for long-term care insurance policies, and creates training requirements for licensed insurance producers related to long-term care insurance.
- 3 SB1255** Administrative Rules Oversight Committee.  
Establishes the Administrative Rules Oversight Committee (AROC).
- 4 SB1406** Municipal development fees; procedures.  
Amends the procedures for the implementation of municipal and county development fees, prohibits new municipal development fees for 24 months after final approval of the development and prohibits counties from assessing development fees to schools, except for street, water and sewer utilities improvements.
- 5 HB2017** Greenhouse emissions; regulations; fuel economy.  
States that a state agency shall not adopt or enforce a state or regional program to regulate the emission of greenhouse gas or motor vehicle fuel economy without express legislative authorization.
- 6 HB2092** Transportation plans; ballot format.  
Requires that any state or county transportation plan that is subject to voter approval and that contains more than one transportation mode to be delineated on the ballot by each transportation mode. In addition, HB 2092 requires the ballot to be written to allow the voter to vote separately for each transportation mode on the ballot. The bill also requires that each transportation mode cost be listed separately.
- 7 HB2098** Corporate tax credit; tuition organizations.  
Eliminates the sunset date for the corporate income tax credit for donations to a student tuition organization.
- 8 HB2100** Tax credits; withholding tax reduction.  
Allows employers to reduce withholding tax amounts for employees who plan to make contributions that would qualify for an individual income tax credit to a public school or school tuition organization.
- 9 HB2154** County plans; major amendments.  
Allows, rather than requires, the board of supervisors (BOS) of a county to refer major amendments to the county's Comprehensive Plan (Plan) to the county's Planning and Zoning Commission (Commission).
- 10 HB2155** Transfer of development rights.  
Allows counties to transfer development rights from unincorporated areas of a county to a municipality through an Intergovernmental Agreement (IGA).
- 11 HB2156** Railroad projects; review.  
Requires railroads that have identified potential sites for a major rail project to provide specified information to the Department of Transportation (ADOT) and requires ADOT to review the existing or proposed major rail project and hold at least one public hearing to record public comments.
- 12 HB2220** State equalization property tax repeal.  
Repeals the state equalization property tax.
- 13 HB2235** Administrative Rules Oversight Committee (AROC).  
Establishes the Administrative Rules Oversight Committee.

Bill Summaries

- 14 HB2288** Initiative and referendum amendments.  
Modifies deadlines and procedures relating to initiatives and referendums, affecting the solicitation, verification, and counting of signatures. It also outlines the notification duties of the Secretary of State pertaining to political committees.
- 15 HB2378** Counties; debit card acceptance.  
Allows counties to accept debit and credit card payments.
- 16 HB2418** Telecommunications Companies; property tax valuation.  
Reduces the minimum value of personal property for telecommunications companies from 20% good to 10% good beginning in 2010.
- 17 HB2615** Solar construction permits.  
Specifies the standards municipalities and counties must adopt regarding permits for solar energy devices and creates the Local Government Solar Equipment Permit Process Improvement Study Committee (Committee).
- 18 HB2653** Tax credit; research and development.  
Increases the amount of the Research and Development (R&D) income tax credits over two years.
- 19 HB2745** Employer sanctions.  
An emergency measure that makes numerous changes to the Legal Arizona Workers Act, modifies the crimes of taking identity of another person or entity and trafficking in the identity of another person or entity, creates the Enhanced Employer Compliance Program, addresses employees paid in cash, the use of E-Verify in regard to government contracts and economic development incentives and prohibits the issuing of business licenses in Arizona before certain documents have been presented.
- 20 HB2766** Omnibus energy act of 2008.  
Establishes energy efficiency goals for residential and commercial construction, schools and state buildings. The bill also addresses renewable energy goals for public utilities, engine idling and requires a study of greenhouse gas emissions.
- 21 HB2828** Workers' compensation; claims.  
Clarifies the timeframe and circumstances for reopening claims in workers' compensation cases and contains an intent clause.
- 22 HCM2013** Arizona temporary worker program; memorial.  
Urges federal authorization for the Arizona Temporary Worker Program (ATWP).
- 23 HCR2026** Redistricting commission; elected members.  
Modifies the membership of the Independent Redistricting Commission from five appointed members to elected members representing each of Arizona's
- 24 HCR2072** Repeal state equalization property tax.  
Asks voters for approval at the next general election to permanently repeal the state equalization assistance property tax.
- 25 HCR2073** Suspension of state property tax.  
Asks voters for approval at the next general election to suspend the state equalization assistance property tax rate for 2009 through 2011.
